1. Continue to address funding issues for health services.  
Strategies:
  - a. Continue to provide input to the consultation process.
  - b. Monitor System changes and position HSACCC to respond as changes impact students and health services.
  - c. Develop alternative funding sources for Health Services.
  - d. Collaborate with other stakeholders to promote health services in CCCs.
2. Pursue legislation for health services funding reform.
  - a. Identify specific legislators to develop and carry health services funding reform.
  - b. Develop strategies to gain legislative support.
3. Develop Health Services role as an interactive participant in the Student Services Council.
  - a. Communicate and strategize with the Student Services constituents to address student services concerns
  - b. Garner understanding and support for health services issues.
4. Collect and disseminate accurate usable data about health services in California Community Colleges.
  - a. Establish a Research Committee.
  - b. Develop and pilot a system wide data collection tool related to health services issues.
5. Maintain adequate information resources for the membership.
  - a. Continue ongoing web page administration and maintenance.
  - b. Continue communication chains through electronic communication.
  - c. Conduct educational conference in spring 2005.
6. Finalize organizational restructure of HSACCC.
  - a. Revise by-laws to reflect organizational changes.
  - b. Ratify by-law changes.

**OBJECTIVES**

1. Re-define the current mission and purpose of the organization.
2. Develop a revised organizational structure.
3. Develop a state budget and standardized fiscal procedures.

4. Modify the bylaws to reflect functional changes, organizational structure, succession, and consistency.
