



Executive Board Retreat Goals for 2008-2009 May 5, 2008

The purpose of the association shall be to advocate, promote and improve health services for students in the California Community Colleges by:

1. Establishing and upgrading professional qualifications and program standards.
2. Providing consultation, leadership, and support for health services programs.
3. Promoting and facilitating continuing education for health services personnel.
4. Initiating, promoting and monitoring legislation that will support and advance health care services in California Community Colleges.
5. Promoting communication and support among health services personnel in California Community Colleges.
6. Conducting research and publishing in the community college health care field.

Goals:

1. *Establish the goals of the legislative committee*
 - a. Appoint an individual to monitor legislation until such time as committee goals are established.
 - b. Report important legislative issues pertinent to the organization to the executive board.
2. *Refine the operation of the research committee via by-law review, policy and procedure development.*
 - a. Establish procedure for official surveys and other research on behalf of the membership.
 - i. Consistent annual methodology for on-going routine data collection.
 - b. Establish data collection methodology for HSACCC.
 - c. Establish a process for web posting.
 - d. Delineate research methods for gathering health services quantifiable data.
3. *Ensure fiscal solvency and continued stability of the organization.*
 - a. Analyze costs of organizational expenditures relative to revenue.

- b. Critically reevaluate annual conference costs.
4. *Explore and implement continued opportunities for “green” alternatives in organizational initiatives, promoting good stewardship of resources.*
 - a. Continue to improve association communication via exploration and utilization of advanced communication technology.
 5. *Maintain HSACCC’s active role in the CCC system to increase the organization’s visibility throughout the state.*
 - a. Continue to provide input to the Consultation Council for the CCCCCO (California Community College Chancellor’s Office).
 - b. Monitor the Chancellor’s System Office and the Board of Governors as their efforts impact students and health services.
 - c. Maintain advocacy role in the system as it pertains to Student Health Services.
 - i. Address the content of health services information on the Chancellor’s website.
 - d. Communicate, strategize and participate with other Student Services constituents to address student services concerns.
 - i. Mental Health
 - ii. Foster Youth
 - iii. Returning Veterans
 - e. Establish connection with professional publications.
 6. *Continue to address local and state funding stabilization issues for health services.*
 - a. Position paper on Mental Health.
